There are twenty mysteries reflected upon in the Rosary, and these are divided into the five *Joyful Mysteries*, the five *Luminous Mysteries*, the five *Sorrowful Mysteries*, and the five *Glorious Mysteries*.

A plenary indulgence is granted, if the Rosary is recited in a church or public oratory or in a family group, a religious Community or pious Association; a partial indulgence is granted in other circumstances. ### Rosaries for Life - September 28-November 10, 2016

**What:** Rosaries for Life is a prayer campaign. The entire Diocese of Charleston comes together prayerfully to end the assaults on the sanctity of life through abortion, euthanasia, embryonic stem cell research, cloning, death penalty – all attacks on life. We recite the Rosary as defined for this campaign as 5 decades of a given mystery corresponding to the day of the week.

**How:** Pray the rosary often – and with sincerity. *Rosaries for Life* will take place in conjunction with the *40 Days for Life Campaign* of prayer and fasting. Use the slips in the church to turn in your rosary count each week. Please place your slip in the Rosaries for Life basket at the back of the church. The tally will be counted weekly and sent to [FamilyLife@catholic-doc.org](mailto:FamilyLife@catholic-doc.org).

Individuals, families, prayers groups, young, old, healthy, sick, religious, laity – You! Everyone is invited to participate. This is a great opportunity for families to pray together. Let's shower heaven with prayer, not just from our lips but from our hearts.

**Where:** Anywhere, your home, at church, during Adoration or at the abortion clinic.

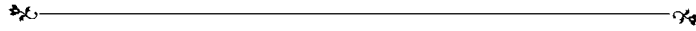
**When:** The time is now for us to empower prayer for the sanctity of life. Please Help!

*40 Days for Life* is a *peaceful* prayer vigil held outside of abortion facilities to pray for an end to abortion and to offer support and alternatives for women in crisis pregnancies. Approximately 2,000 abortions take place yearly at the Charleston Women's Medical Center, 1312 Ashley River Rd. in West Ashley. Help us reduce this number with your prayers and presence outside the center? Our Fall Campaign began 28 Sept., and runs through 6 Nov. During this time, we need two prayer witnesses every hour in order to keep the vigil going. Won't you join us to end the evil of abortion? 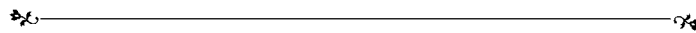

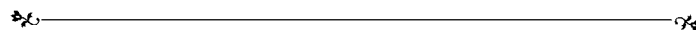
