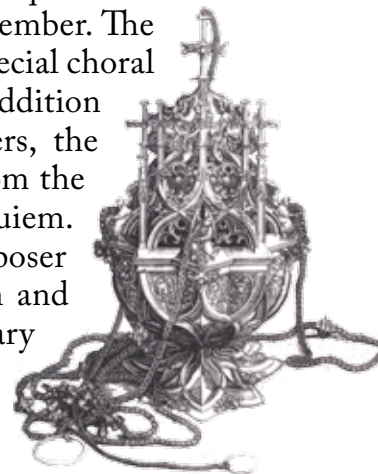

Rosaries for Life - September 28-November 10, 2016

What: Rosaries for Life is a prayer campaign. When: The time is now for us to empower prayer for the sanctity of life. Please Help!

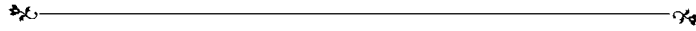
