Diaconate Formation Program

In communion with the bishop and priests, deacons are ordained for a distinct ministry, which is indicated by their name: they are ordained for service. They function in all three areas of the Church's life: transmission of the Word, celebrating of the sacraments, and in the community's active love. The deacon, therefore, is more properly defined in terms of who he is rather than of what he does. He is a visible sign of the Church's call to "diakonia" — service. He is both servant and sacrament.

And Jesus Wept...

Only twice in scripture do we hear of Our Lord publicly weeping; once over Jerusalem and her refusal to come under his wing, and once at the death of Lazarus. Or was it because of Lazarus? I would think it was a combination of these things and only the Spirit has known the mind of God. What should move us to tears is the fact that Our Lord had any reason to weep at all, let alone suffer the horrifically wicked things that were to come. Let us ask Our Lord for the grace of holy mourning, not at our own suffering, but that of the world, all our brothers and sisters. Let us mourn the outrages that God constantly suffers on our behalf; and yet, let us wait in joyful hope.

Passiontide:

The two weeks between Passion Sunday and Easter. The rubrical prescriptions of the Roman Missal, Breviary, and "Caeremoniale Episcoporum" for this time are: before Vespers of Saturday preceding Passion Sunday the crosses, statues, and pictures of Our Lord and of the saints on the altar and throughout the church, with the sole exception of the crosses and pictures of the Way of the Cross, are to be covered with a violet veil, not translucent, nor in any way ornamented. The crosses remain covered until after the solemn denudation of the principal crucifix on Good Friday. The statues and pictures retain their covering, no matter what feast may occur, until the Gloria in Excelsis of Holy Saturday.

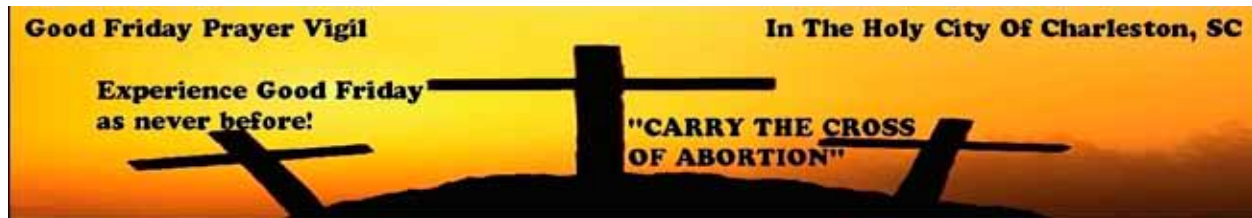

5th Annual GOOD FRIDAY PRAYER VIGIL

Christians of all denominations are invited to join in solemn prayer on Good Friday at Charleston Women's Medical Center where approximately 2000 abortions up to 16 weeks are done each year. [Local area pastors](#) will lead in scripture and prayer throughout the morning as we meditate on our redemption won by Christ. We will experience a powerful and moving commemoration of our Savior's death by attending this solemn Vigil. It will be a time of deep reflection and strengthening of conviction for all who attend.

We refrain on this solemn day of our Lord's death from using signs that would connote a picket or demonstration to the public. Instead, [a life-sized cross](#) will be our only sign as we carry the cross of abortion, keeping the prayerful focus of the day on the cross of Christ. Prayers will be offered for all victims of abortion –the children lost, the mothers and fathers wounded, the communities blighted –as well as for those responsible for perpetuating this injustice, from "pro-choice" elected officials to those working in the abortion industry.

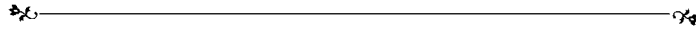
