Candlemas

2 February 2017, 12:05PM


Candlemas is a solemnity celebrating Jesus' presentation at the temple. It is one of the oldest feasts and has been celebrated since the fourth century.

This feast has for long been associated with many popular devotional exercises. Such as the blessing of candles which were carried in procession in honor of Christ, 'the light to enlighten the Gentiles' (Lk 2, 32).

The Presentation of the Lord concludes the celebration of the Nativity and with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon, the events now point toward Easter.

Candles to be blessed at Candlemas can be ordered in advance. Envelopes are located in the back of the church. For donation of \$5 you receive two candles. The deadline has past, however, please let us know if you wish to have a set of candles as there may be a limited supply left. Envelopes may be placed in the collection or returned to the Parish Office at 119 Broad Street.

Blessed candles will be available for pickup after the 12:05pm Mass at the Cathedral on 2 February, or in the Parish Office after 2 February.


