Candlemas

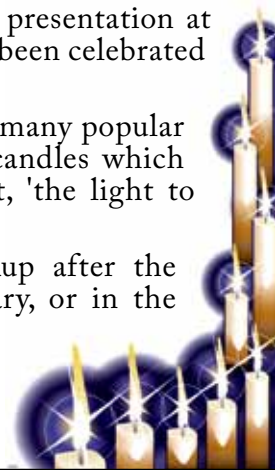
February 2, 2017, 12:05pm

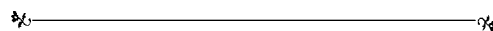
