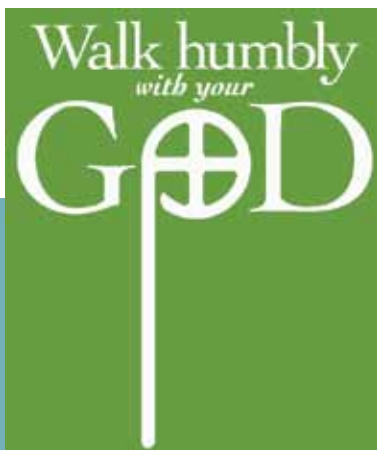

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Every year the National Catholic Education Association promotes a week-long celebration of Catholic Schools, and, as in the past, we here in South Carolina begin Catholic Schools Week on the last Sunday in January –January 31<sup>st</sup> this year.

We have good reason to celebrate. Catholic schools in the United States have produced saints and scholars, selfless professionals and skilled laborers, humanitarians and civil servants, clergy and religious and well-trained lay ministers. Our schools have equipped students who are well prepared for a lifetime of commitment to faith and family. The schools succeed in this because they focus on educating the whole person. Our Catholic schools offer a wealth of spiritual, academic, athletic, artistic, and civic opportunities.

Here in the Diocese of Charleston we are growing not only in attendance but also in the number of schools which open their doors each year. We have 28 elementary schools, 2 of which (St. Gregory the Great in Bluffton and Holy Trinity in Longs) opened within the last ten years. We will have 4 diocesan secondary schools when St. Elizabeth Ann Seton opens in 2016-2017. Bishop England High School on Daniel Island marked its 100<sup>th</sup> year in 2015, Cardinal Newman School in Columbia (grades 7-12) has just settled into a new state-of-the-art building, and John Paul II Catholic School in Ridgeland (currently grades 7-11) will graduate its first seniors in May 2017. St. Anne in Rock Hill has also initiated our first venture into a K-12 parish school, with its first high school class set to graduate in May 2018. In addition, we rejoice in two private Catholic high schools – St. Joseph in Greenville and St. Francis Xavier in Sumter.

Our growth is a sign of God's blessing and also evidence of the dedication of so very many people who believe that our religious values and our insistence on excellence positively affect the present and the future of our Church, our nation, and our world.

Let us all participate in the many observances of Catholic Schools Week which will be taking place in our area. As we meet the schools' children and youth, teachers and coaches and volunteers, we can see clearly why the NCEA speaks repeatedly of our schools as Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service. Together, we are fulfilling Christ's command to "Go, teach all nations" (Matthew 28:19).
