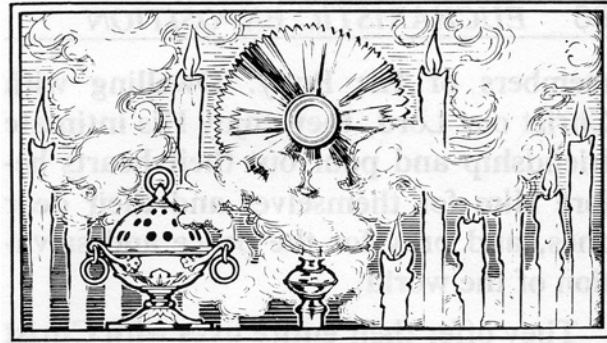

## **The Solemnity of Corpus Christi**

### ***Parish Offices Moving This Week***

Coinciding with the vacating of 119 Broad Street by the Cathedral offices, our parish Secretary, Becky Achterhof, will relocate temporarily to a room in the rear of our church on Hasell Street pending the renovation of the two ground floor offices in the rear of the rectory (see below).

### ***Building and Grounds Team Forming***

Do you have experience in construction, renovation, and maintenance? This team will oversee routine maintenance of parish facilities through the management of contractors and service technicians, and will lead the parish through renovation projects.

It is imperative that this project be completed as soon as possible so that the offices may then move in.

## What you do:

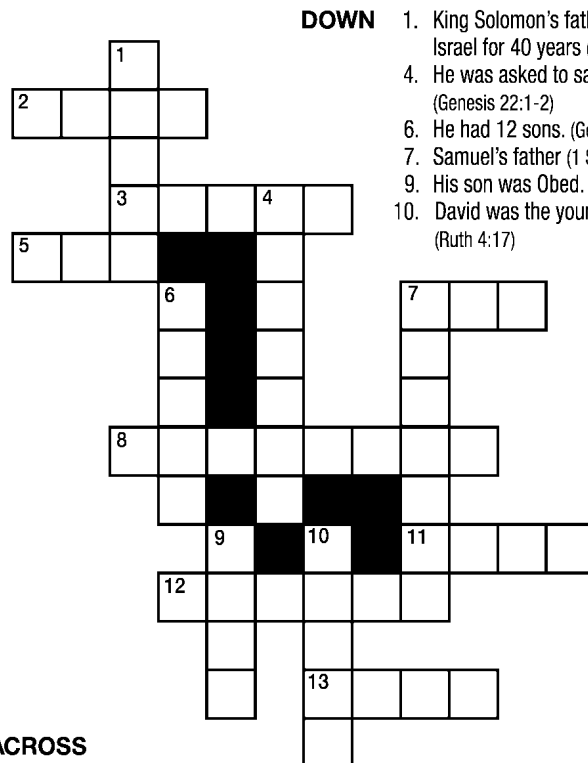
1. With an adult, purchase a variety of candy.

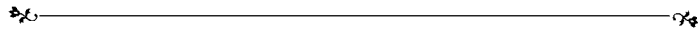
