## Respect Life News

**40 Days for Life** is a peaceful prayer vigil held outside of abortion facilities nationwide to pray for an end to abortion and to offer support and alternatives for women in crisis pregnancies. Approximately 2,000 abortions take place yearly right in West Ashley at the Charleston Women's Medical Center, 1312 Ashley River Road. Help us reduce this number by your prayers and presence outside the clinic.

## Jubilee Year of Mercy

### March: Clothe the Naked

"Clothe The Naked," seems rather straightforward. One would think that it simply means to give clothes to someone who doesn't have any. While that certainly is an aspect of this work of mercy, it does not paint the whole picture. Jesus challenges us to be much more active when he said to the sheep on his right, "[I was] naked, and you covered me" (Matthew 25:36).

- Go through your drawers and closets and find good-condition clothes and shoes to donate to agencies that provide assistance for those in need;
- Donate professional clothing that needy can wear on job interviews or, if they get the job, clothes they can wear to work everyday.
- Volunteer to work at a clothing drive or at a shelter where clothing is distributed to those in need
- Support the work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society
