Sidewalk Advocates for Life Training: Are you interested in a peaceful, prayerful method of reaching out to women and men entering the abortion facility and encouraging them to choose life? This new "sidewalk counseling" program employs a compassionate, womancentered approach to take the crisis out of crisis pregnancies and thereby save babies' lives.
