Be Part of the Beginning of the End of Abortion: *40 Days for Life* is a peaceful prayer vigil held outside of abortion facilities nationwide to pray for an end to abortion and to offer support and alternatives for women in crisis pregnancies. Approximately 2,000 abortions take place yearly right in West Ashley at the Charleston Women's Medical Center, 1312 Ashley River Road. Will you help us reduce this number by your prayers and presence outside the clinic?

Our Spring Campaign begins 10 February and runs through 20 March. During this time, we need two prayer warriors every hour in order to keep the vigil going. (We're one of the few sites in the country that operates a 24-hour vigil!) Sidewalk Advocates for Life Training: Are you interested in a peaceful, prayerful method of reaching out to women and men entering the abortion facility and encouraging them to choose life? If so, Sidewalk Advocates for Life training is for you! This new "sidewalk counseling" program employs a compassionate, woman-centered approach to take the crisis out of crisis pregnancies and thereby save babies' lives. This is not about judging women: the program focuses instead on extending Christ's love through education, conversation, and practical help (i.e. connecting women to local pregnancy centers for further support).

The next two-day training session will be held at Immaculate Conception Church in Goose Creek on Friday, 29 January, from 6:30 to 10:00PM and Saturday, 30 January, from 1:00PM to 5:00PM. Registration (payable at the door) is \$15 and includes course materials and refreshments. "This training will also allow you to better understand and help anyone you know who is thinking about an abortion or has had an abortion in their family. After training, you can then consider donating time as either a "prayer partner" supporting a sidewalk counselor or as a "peer counselor" reaching out in love to families in crisis. We ask you donate two hours a month to either of these volunteer efforts. Please realize your simple "prayerful presence" at the abortion site will change hearts and minds and will be a "spiritual work of mercy" in this "Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy"!

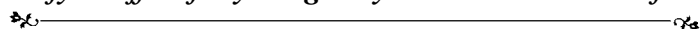
