I wanted to update everyone on the peeling painting over the high altar. Larry Long and I have met with several experts in architecture and painting preservation and restoration to determine the cause and discuss the repairs to the peeling paint in the main sanctuary. There is no water leaking from the roof, however, it seems possible that moisture forming around the condensation lines from the air conditioning units in the church attic may be dripping into the wall.

Over time, this water dripping onto the plaster of the main sanctuary wall may well be the cause of the crumbling plaster and peeling paint.

It has been recommended to place a drip pan under all the condensation lines in the attic air handler units to prevent water intrusion.

Another concern is the general humidity level in the building. Masonry buildings tend to wick moisture into the walls, and that, coupled with the extremely humid and wet winter we experienced this past year, has made for an actual sweating of the plaster walls and floors. This sweating is particularly detrimental to the historic paintings as well as the plaster instability. The recommendation was that air vents be placed in the wall behind the sanctuary to help ventilate the wall. We have also made a concerted effort to run the air conditioning system all the time in order to prevent temperature and humidity extremes in the room

Once this work is done and the walls are sufficiently dry, the painting and inscription above the high altar will be repaired.


First Holy Communion: Many of our St. Mary and Cathedral children are finalizing their preparations to recieve the sacrament of First Holy Communion.
