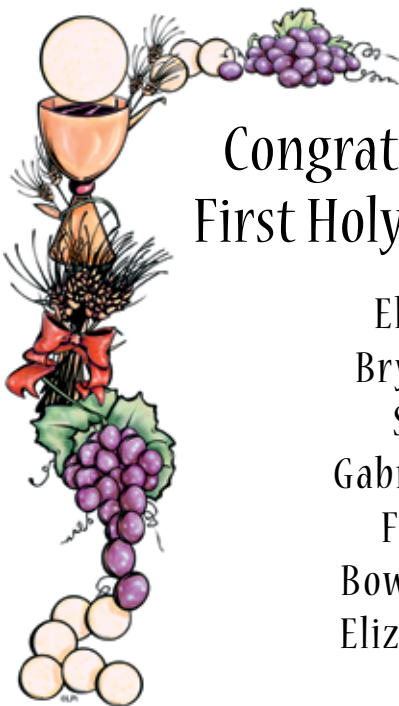

Respect Life News

Sidewalk Advocacy Training:

Sidewalk advocates for life is a peaceful, prayerful sidewalk advocacy program that trains people; how to most effectively offer loving, life-affirming alternatives to women and men entering the abortion facility.

Are you interested in a peaceful, prayerful method of reaching out to women and men entering the abortion facility and encouraging them to choose life? If so, Sidewalk Advocates for Life training is for you! This new "sidewalk counseling" program employs a compassionate, woman-centered approach to take the crisis out of crisis pregnancies and thereby save babies' lives. This is not about judging women: the program focuses instead on extending Christ's love through education, conversation, and practical help (i.e. connecting women to local pregnancy centers for further support). The next two-day training session will be held at Blessed Sacrament Church in West Ashley on Friday, April 29th, from 6:30PM to 10:00PM and Saturday, April 30th, from 1:00PM to 5:00PM. Registration (payable at the door) is \$15 and includes course materials and refreshments. The only prerequisites are a humble desire to reach out in love and a willingness to volunteer two hours a month -- either as a prayer partner or a counselor -- "on the sidewalk" at the abortion clinic after training is completed. The Sacrament of Matrimony: Either the bride or the groom must be a practicing Catholic and registered at St. Marys for at least twelve months before scheduling a wedding date and beginning the six months marriage preparation. The bride/groom must be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and use the envelope system in regular support of the parish.
