As you are aware, the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry in the Diocese of Charleston exists to draw young people to responsible participation in the life, mission, and worship of the Catholic Church.

The DMT will serve as a dynamic tool that will allow us to fulfill St. John Paul II's mandate for a new evangelization in a very powerful and tangible way. It is my belief that the DMT will radically challenge and encourage our youth to embrace the life and mission of the Catholic Church.

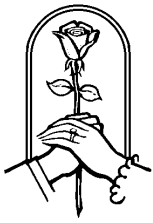
On August 14, 2016, through second collection efforts, our parishes will have the opportunity to help fund some of the excellent programming offered through the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. 50% of the funds collected will be used to offset the start-up costs of the DMT program. The other 50% will be used to provide scholarships for youth who otherwise might not have the opportunity due to financial constraints to attend programs such as the Diocesan Youth conferences, retreats and summer camps.

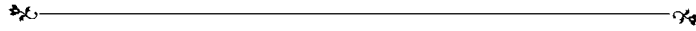

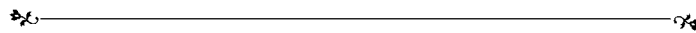

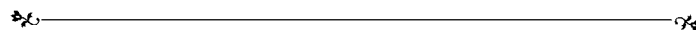
