## *Buildings and Grounds Update*

The newly established Buildings and Grounds Team held their first meeting on August 22. Father West presented them with proposed guidelines which define the mission and scope of the team's work. The guidelines were modified and accepted by all present. In effect, the B&GT will:

1. In consultation with the pastor, oversee all activities associated with the operation, maintenance, safety and security of all buildings, grounds, furnishings, and equipment owned by the parish, except items expressly the responsibility of another parish group.
2. Perform a detailed quarterly inspection of buildings, grounds, furnishings, and equipment owned by the parish and determines what, if any, action should be taken. If work is to be done, develop a Scope of Work, budget and time line for review and approval by the Pastor and Finance Council.
3. Maintain an inventory of furniture and fixtures, and warranties thereof, to be filed in the parish offices.
4. Stay informed of and ensure code compliance, OSHA, and Catholic Mutual requirements.
5. Organize and host an "All Church Work Day" as needs require.

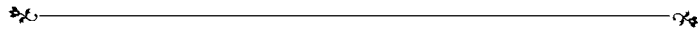
