

## Wednesday School!

From Father Allen -

Corpus Christi Catholic Community will be offering Christian formation classes on Wednesday evenings beginning October 4<sup>th</sup>. There will be a family supper (pizza or the like) at 5:30PM, with classes beginning at 6:00PM. Adults will be viewing and discussing Bishop Robert Barron's series *Catholicism: the Pivotal Players* ([pivotalplayers.wordonfire.org/](http://pivotalplayers.wordonfire.org/)), "a multi-part film series that illumines a handful of saints, artists, mystics, and scholars who not only shaped the life of the Church but changed the course of civilization."

For children ages 4 and up, Corpus Christi's approach to religious formation is based upon the "Catechesis of the Good Shepherd" model. See [www.ncregister.com/blog/simcha-fisher/a-little-about-catechesis-of-the-good-shepherd](http://www.ncregister.com/blog/simcha-fisher/a-little-about-catechesis-of-the-good-shepherd) for a description:

*Catechesis of the Good Shepherd was founded in the 50's by two Italian laywomen, one a scriptural scholar and one an expert in Montessori education. Together they conceived of a simple, attractive method for sharing the richness of the Faith with children, who are uniquely capable of accepting the beauty of God's love. The program is presented in three levels, and includes time in the "Atrium," which is a quiet environment where children learn through tactile play.*

*Catechesis of the Good Shepherd emphasizes quiet contemplation and -- imagine this -- "the enjoyment of God." The children hear Bible stories and watch them acted out with simple materials; they learn songs and prayers, and are encouraged to play quietly with simple and meaningful objects. One mother explained that CGS "cracked the code" of the Mass for her son, as he learned to become alert to the details of the liturgy: the significance of color, the names and purposes of the various vessels and tools on the altar.*

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** is the process of formation for people to enter the full communion of the Catholic Church, that is, those who were never baptized, people of other Christian and non-Christian traditions, and baptized Catholics who never received First Eucharist and/or Confirmation. It serves as a kind of "Inquirers' Class" for those interested in the Catholic Church, and is also the place for any Catholic who simply wants a "refresher course" in the basics of the Faith.

Deacon Paul Rosenblum will be leading the RCIA formation sessions on Thursday evenings at the Citadel in Mark Clark Hall (Room 350) from 6-7:30PM. The next class is on October 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Mass on First Fridays:** Mass is offered at noon on the first Friday of each month as a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will follow Mass, with Benediction given at 1:00PM.

It was the special desire of our Lord Jesus Christ, revealed to Blessed Margaret Mary Alacoque [1647-1690], that the first Friday of each month be consecrated to the devotion to and adoration of His most Sacred Heart in reparation for sacrilege, contempt, indifference and ingratitude, even in the sacrament of his love [the Eucharist].

Jesus asked for special prayers and practices to make amends (reparation) for this great neglect to the proper reverence owed to God. For those who did this faithfully, he made what Saint Margaret Mary referred to as the "Great Promise" which was the last and greatest of the Twelve Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

**Mass intentions:** It is the ancient tradition of the Church that priests may apply the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for a particular intention of the faithful and receive an offering for doing so. The intentions are usually for the sick, the faithful departed, or in gratitude for some blessing received. On Sundays and Holy Days, at least one parish Mass must be offered pro populo – that is, for the intentions of all the people of the parish.

When daily Mass was suspended at Saint Mary's two years ago, it was decided that the pro populo Mass at the Cathedral would apply also to Saint Mary's so that the Sunday Mass could be offered for particular intentions. With the restoration of daily Mass at Saint Mary's, we may gladly return to normal practice for Mass Intentions. Going forward, the 9:00AM Sunday Mass is offered pro populo for Saint Mary's, and the 11:00AM Sunday Mass is offered pro populo for the Corpus Christi community. Of course all Mass intentions already received will be offered as planned.

If you would like a Mass offered for a special intention, please contact Becky in the parish office (e-mail; 843.722.7696) to schedule the Mass. In both the Diocese of Charleston and the Ordinariate of the Chair of Saint Peter (for Corpus Christi), the suggested donation for a Mass is \$10.

**Fatima Jubilee at St Mary's:** Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup>, will be the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the culminating apparition of Our Lady the three child seers of Fatima, and of the "miracle of the sun." On that Friday, a statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be solemnly exposed for the veneration of the faithful beginning at 11:00AM. There will be a votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary at noon, with the Rosary and other devotions to follow.

The Holy Father has granted a plenary indulgence to mark this Fatima Jubilee. The indulgence is "granted to those who visit with devotion a statue of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly exposed for public veneration in any church, oratory or proper place during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, which is the 13<sup>th</sup> of each month through October 2017, and there devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary. In addition, the faithful must pray the Our Father, recite the Creed and invoke Our Lady of Fatima" (The Catholic Miscellany).

Come sing Mary's praises, seek her intercession, and allow her to draw you closer to her Son on this great anniversary.

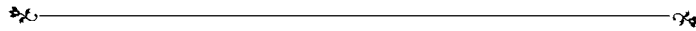
