In addition to the usual Gregorian Chant Propers, the Ordinary of the Mass will be taken from the monumental choral masterpiece, *Requiem*.

Written by 20<sup>th</sup> century French composer Maurice Durufle', this work for organ and choir is based on the familiar Ordinary chants of the Missa pro Defunctis.

The solemn Requiem Mass will be celebrated by Father Allen according to the Ordinariate form with Father West offering the homily. 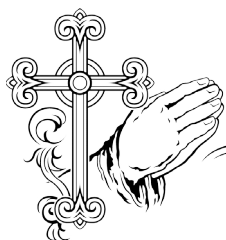

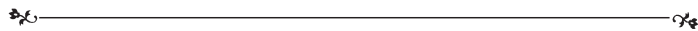
