



The Bells Are Back!

I am happy to report that the sound of bells has returned to Saint Mary's! (Isn't there a movie title like that?) The maintenance work by Christoph Piccard Studios, luckily located right here in Charleston, was minimal, basically just some fine tuning. The sound is now clear, strong, and melodious.

The system is now programmed to chime every quarter hour from 7:00 AM to 9:00 PM daily, plus the Angelus at 7:00 AM, noon, and 6:00 PM daily, plus nine minutes of Call to Worship on Sundays from 8:50 to 8:59 AM and 10:50 to 10:59 AM. Further, on the occasion of a funeral, the bells will toll before and after the Mass.

The hymn player does not work and cannot be repaired.

The solemn Requiem Mass will be celebrated by Father Allen according to the Ordinariate form with Father West offering the homily. 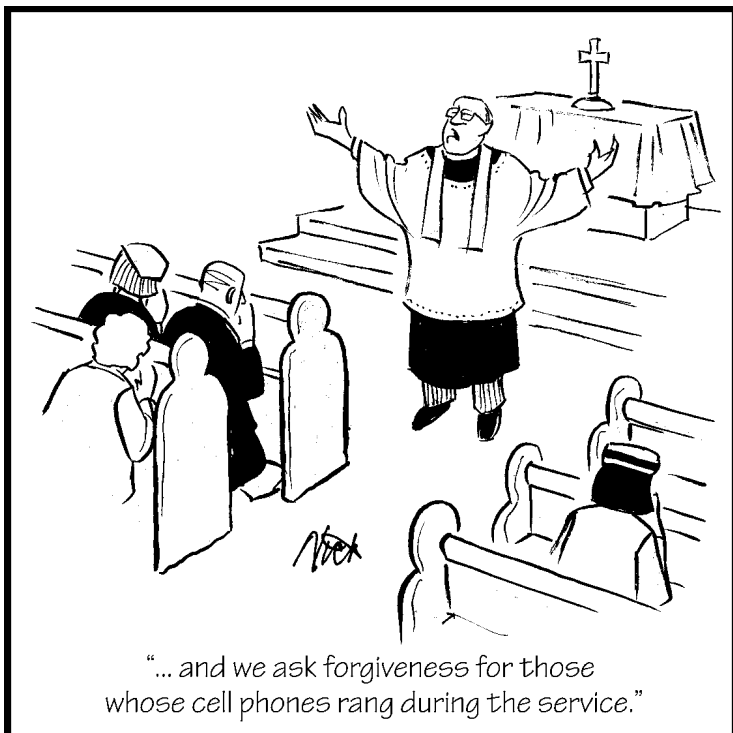

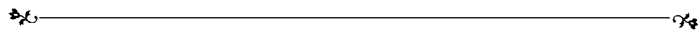

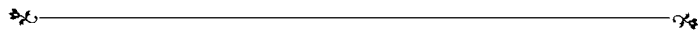
